I hope this map will be your passport and guide to many happy hours of motoring on the "all weather" highways of Manitoba.

This map points out the location of 7,000 miles of Provincial Roads and 3,900 miles of Provincial Trunk Highways in the province. This network of roads, all clearly marked with definite route markers, provides a system of connector and feeder roads serving all communities and recreational areas in the Province.

Manitoba's varied landscape, beaches, lakes, forests and dark green northland offer vacationers and sportsmen alike, enjoyment and recreation. The Provincial Park developments range in location from the Precambrian lakes in the Whiteshell Forest Reserve to the arid expanses of a desert park in the Central Manitoba Sandhills, and from the vast sandy shoreline at Grand Beach on Lake Winnipeg to the multi-colored lakes in the Duck Mountains.

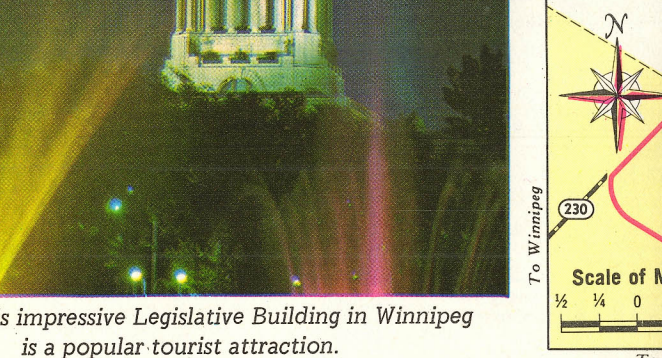


Manitoba's impressive Legislative Building in Winnipeg is a popular tourist attraction.

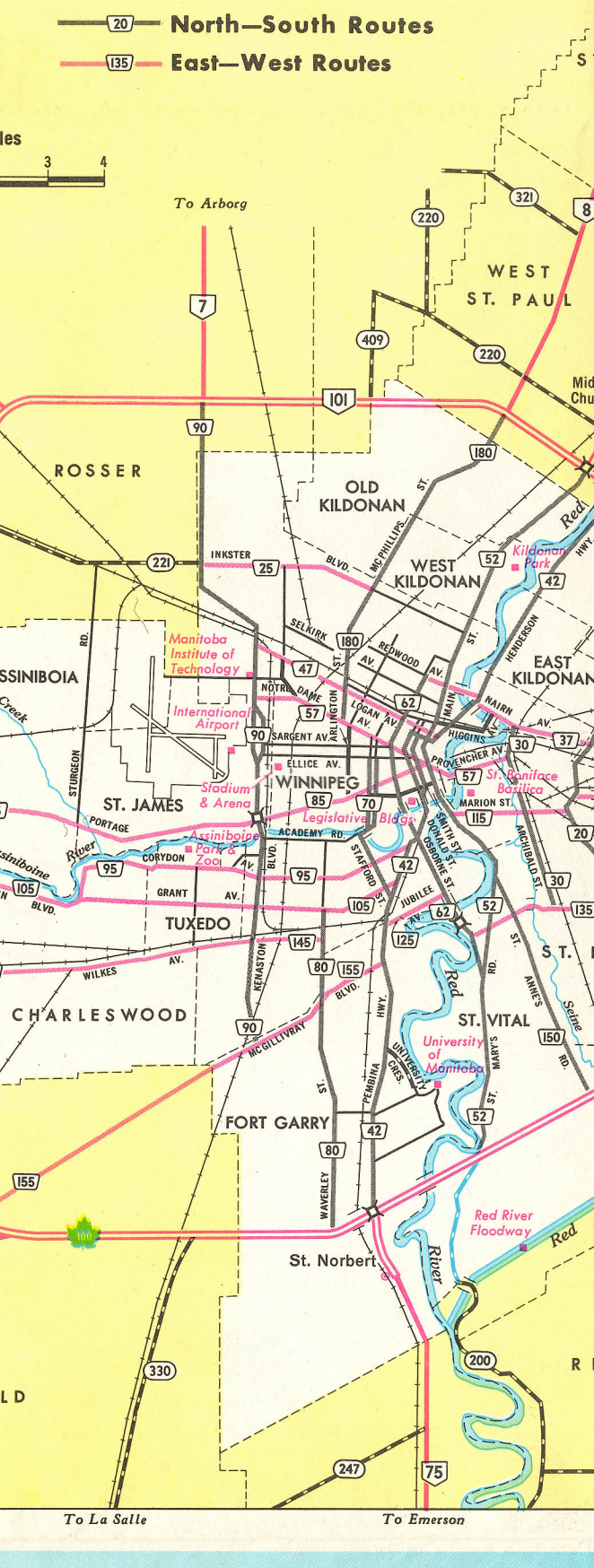

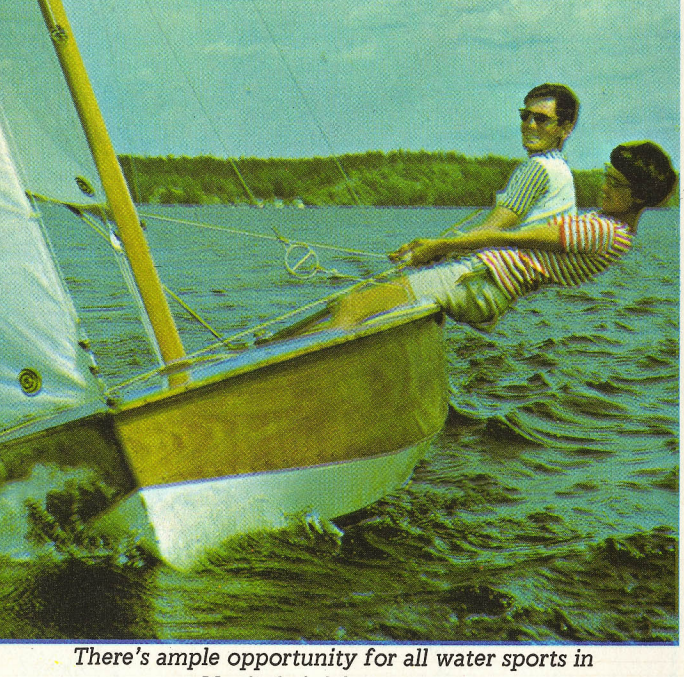

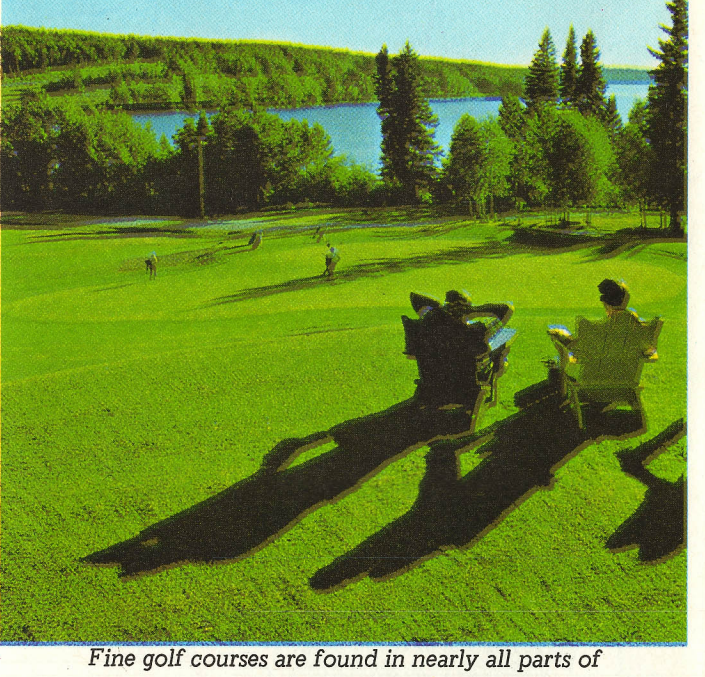
The quiet beauty of Manitoba's parklands is ideal for camping families.

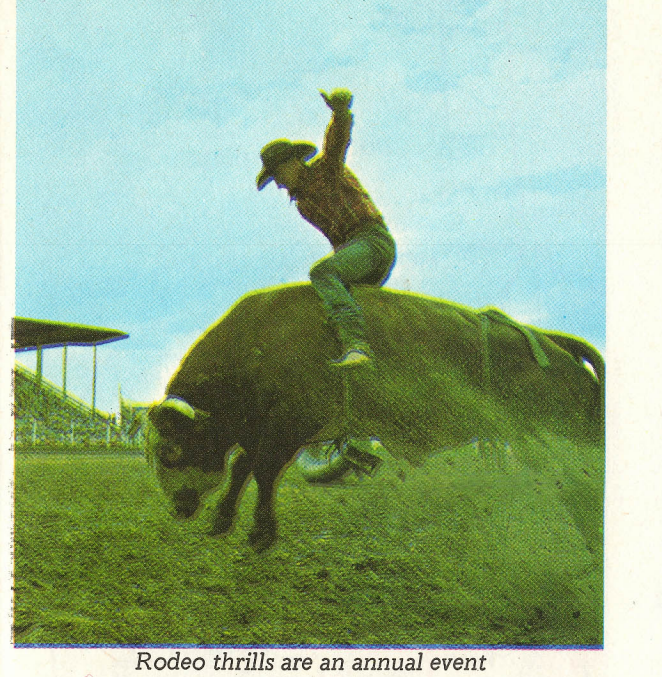

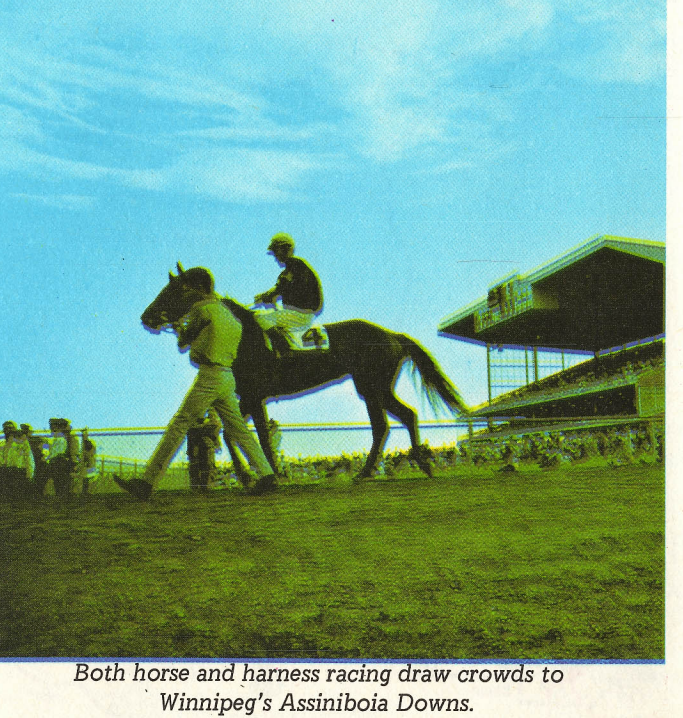

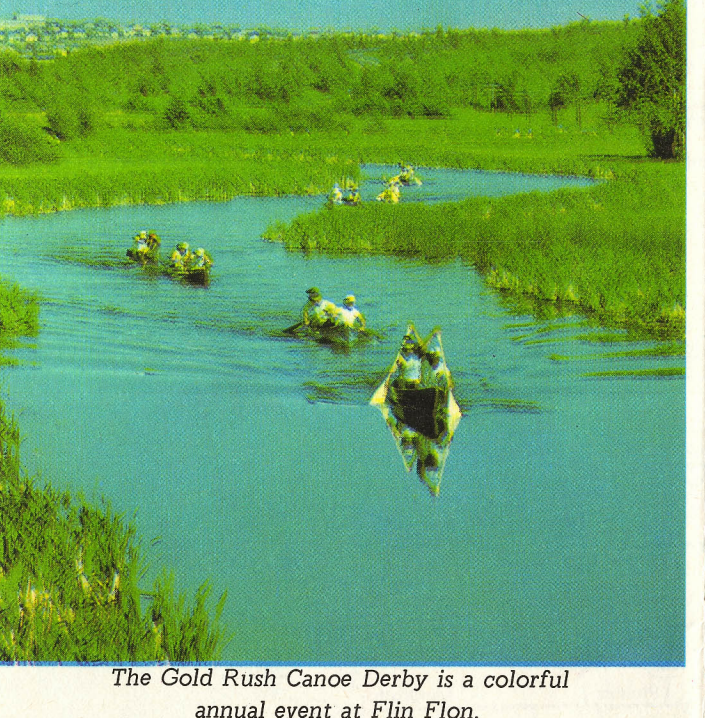

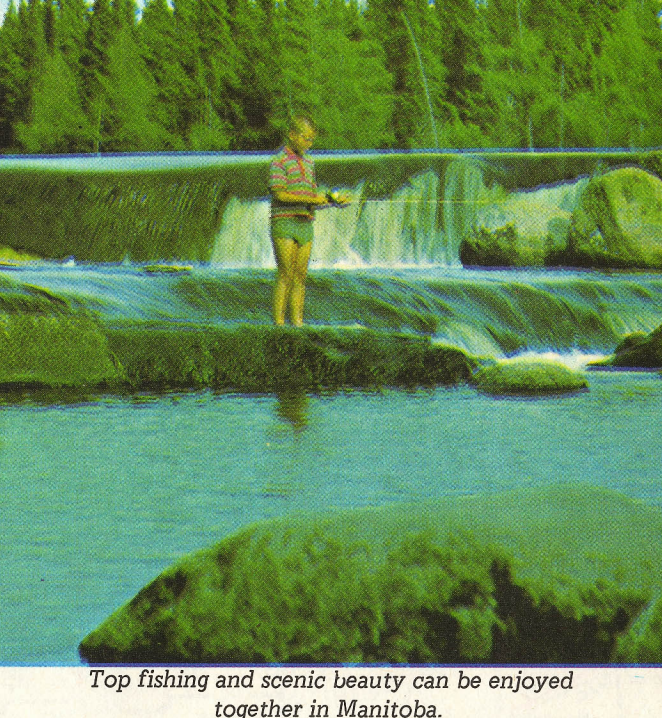

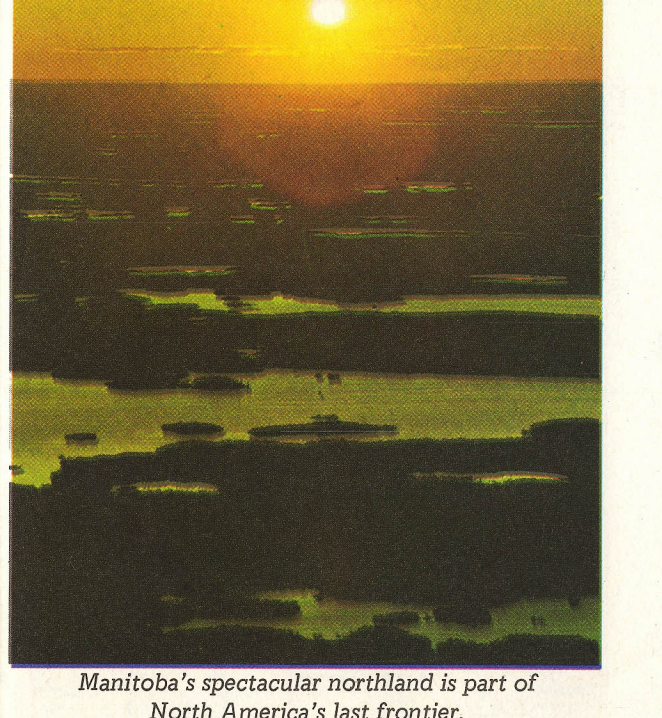
