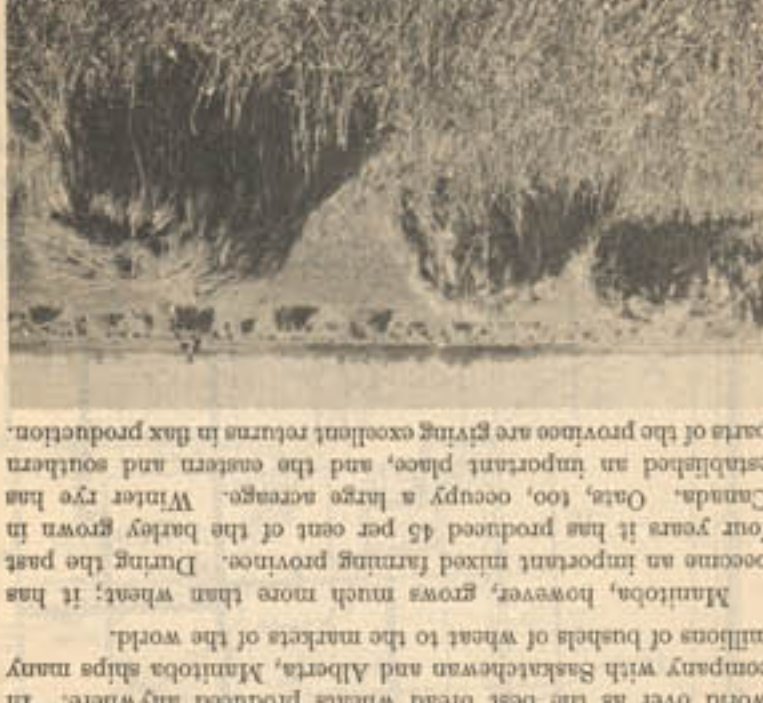
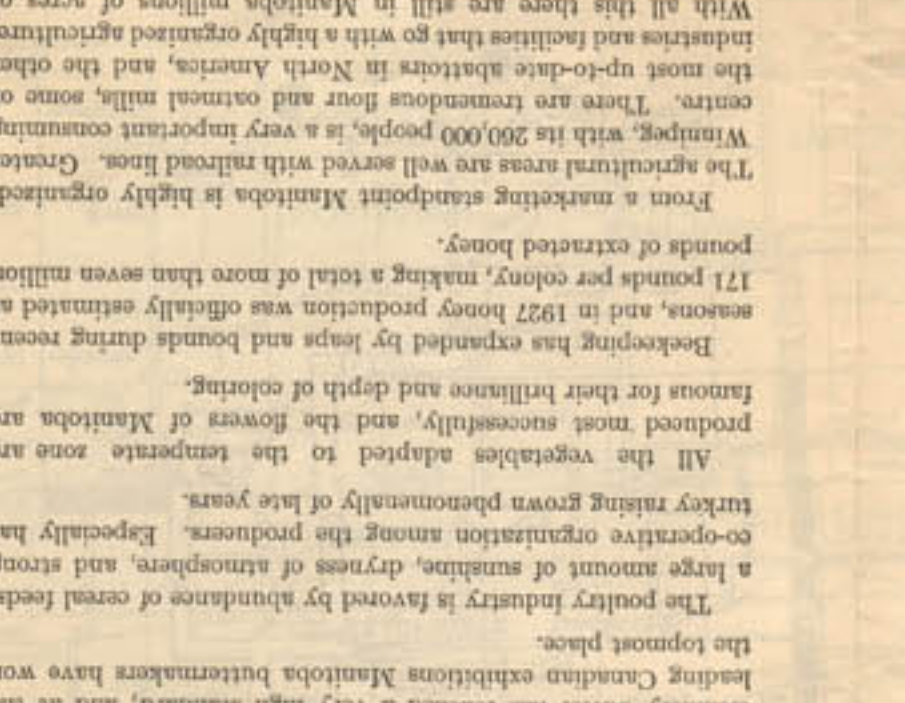

To export any game animals or birds, skins or pelts of fur-bearing animals without the necessary permit. To destroy game birds or animals by poisonous substances. To destroy any beaver or muskrat house. To shoot or spear muskrats. To kill any bird mentioned in "The Insectivorous Birds Act," except sharp-shinned hawk, Cooper's hawk, raven, crow, cowbird, yellow-headed vireo, red-winged blackbird, brown-headed nuthatch, yellow-billed cuckoo, junco, and sparrow.

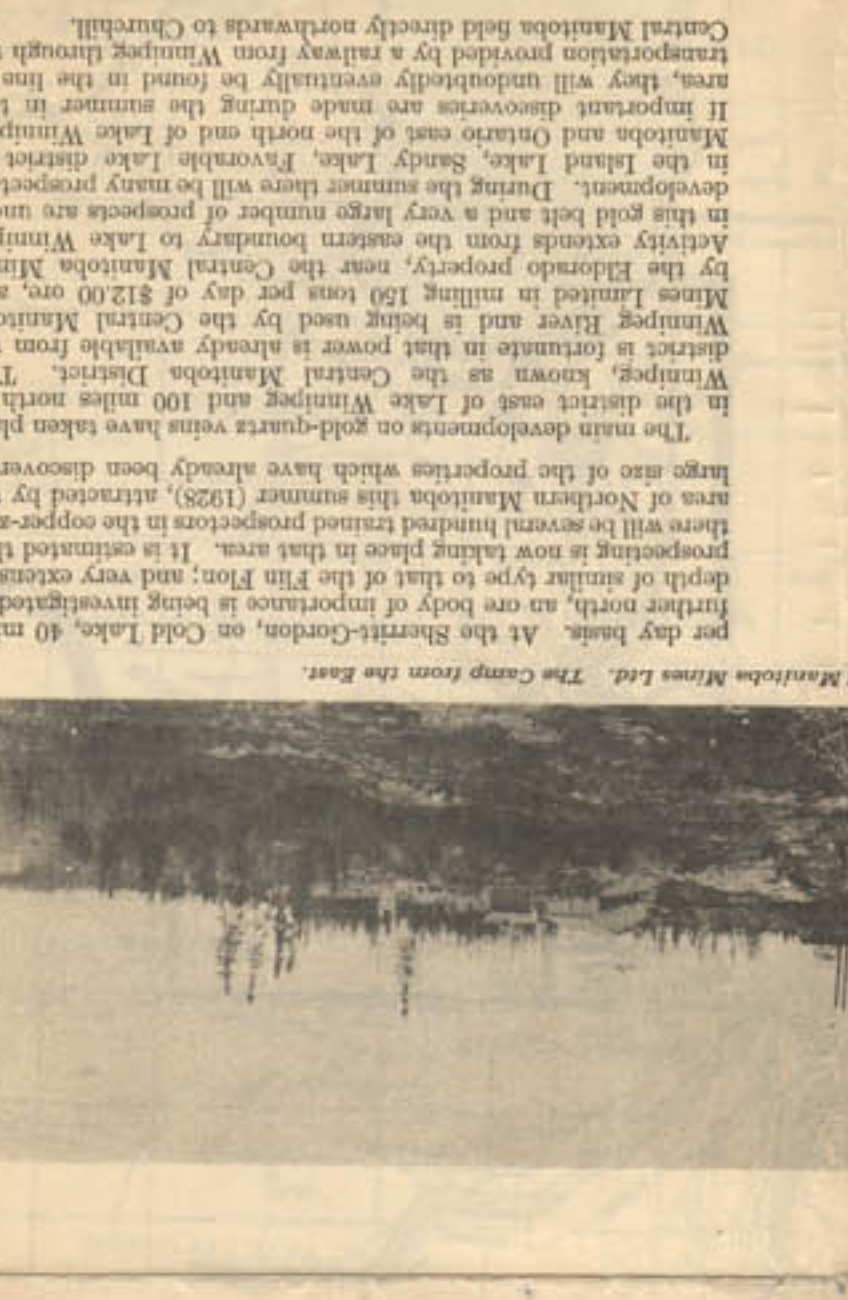

THE MANITOBA POWER COMMISSION

The Manitoba Power Commission was formed in 1919, by Act of the Manitoba Legislature, with the object of making it possible for the people of Rural Manitoba, by means of transmission lines, comprising 60 miles of single circuit, 110,000-volt lines, and 71 miles of single circuit, 4,000-volt lines, and 11 towns and villages in Central and Southern Manitoba. It has a capital of \$100,000,000.

The Commission also operates two isolated plants, Grand Rapids and Wabigoon. These plants are equipped with semi-diesel engines utilizing crude oil as fuel, and are serving districts at present not connected to the transmission lines.

By the use of high voltage transmission lines or isolated plants, every Municipality in Manitoba desirous of obtaining electrical energy can have it at a cost through its Power Commission.
