



## SO MUCH TO SEE AND DO -- IN MANITOBA

**WINNIPEG**  
Horse Racing, the exciting sport of Kings at Assiniboia Downs. Red River Exhibition, industrial showcase and carnival attractions. Highland Games, reels, pipers and athletic events of Scotland. Lower Fort Garry, only stone fur trade post still intact in North America. Assiniboine Park, beautiful gardens, picnic sites, zoo and conservatory. Ross House and Countess of Dufferin, first Post Office and locomotive in Western Canada. Seven Oaks House and Museum, oldest private home in Manitoba. Upper Fort Garry Gate, all that remains of the historic fort. La Verendrye Monument, honors pioneer explorer of Western Canada. St. Boniface Basilica, immortalized in Whittier's poem "The Red River Voyageur". Manitoba Museum and Art Gallery, where mementos and relics of the old west are on display. Legislative Building, one of the continent's most beautiful public buildings.

**WESTERN MANITOBA**  
Provincial Exhibition, Brandon, the industrial and agricultural showcase of Manitoba. Riding Mountain National Park, one of Canada's most popular national parks. Island Park and Bird Sanctuary, Portage la Prairie—well worth a visit. Rock, Pelican and Killarney Lakes, triple gems of the southwest. Viduen Oil Fields, see the pumps operating in the heart of town. Fort Ellice, site of historic fur trade fort on highway 41 near St. Lazare. Perry Park, Westbourne, privately developed for the public good. Delta Waterfowl Station, see ducks and geese under ideal conditions. International Peace Garden, monument to international goodwill on Manitoba-North Dakota border.

**EASTERN MANITOBA**  
All Hole Goose Sanctuary at Rennie—see Canada geese in natural habitat. Whiteshell Forest Reserve, over 200 lakes and rivers provide ideal vacation area. Winnipeg River—Lac du Bonnet—vacation and angling paradise. Falcon Beach, multi-million dollar resort on Trans-Canada Highway. Pine Falls, pulp and paper mill and site of Fort Alexander fur trading post. Emerson Museum, historic relics of former days—site of 1st N.W.M.P. barracks. Hecla Island, Lake Winnipeg, unique tourist resort in Icelandic Settlement. Lockport and Old St. Andrews—fishing, carnival attractions—oldest stone church in Western Canada. Selkirk Docks, berth of S. S. Kenora for Lake Winnipeg cruise to Norway House.

**NORTHERN MANITOBA**  
Fort Prince of Wales and Arctic Museum at Churchill. Flin Flon Trout Festival—fishing contests and carnival attractions. Trappers' Festival at The Pas—winter sports and contests. Northwest Roddy, Swan River, Manitoba's version of the Calgary Stampede. Henry Kelsey Cairn, Sir John Franklin Sun Dial, historic Christ Church at The Pas. Hudson's Bay Mining & Smelting Co. operations at Flin Flon. Bakers Narrows and Cranberry Portage, fabulous fishing areas north of The Pas. Cormorant Forest Reserve and The Pas District, superb fishing, hunting and waterfowl shooting. Pasquia, reclamation and agricultural development at The Pas.
