Highways of Adventure . . .

Manitoba's highways, linking over 600 urban and rural centres with Winnipeg, the capital city, comprise a network of over 6,000 miles. The Trans-Canada Highway spans the province from east to west. The east-west road link with north-south highways, No. 10, extends from the International Border to the mining town of Flin Flon — 522 miles to the north.

Many of Manitoba's highways follow the overland trails of Indians, explorers, and fur traders. Some parallel the old canoe routes or pass over them. Whenever the visitor enters Manitoba by road he will be on or near some route or trail over which passed the pioneers of exploration, trade, and settlement.

In southern Manitoba, far from the present international border, La Verendrye and his sons tracked through the rolling country to the Manitoba country in 1728. More than a century later the first detachment of the North West Mounted Police pressed through hills, valleys, and plains as they marched west to bring law and order to a wild and lawless land.

The highways in eastern Manitoba extend beyond the prairie formations and wind through the lake, river, and forest country. Several highways follow the river routes through which explorers and fur traders penetrated into Manitoba by Lake of the Woods, the Winnipeg River, from the Great Lakes chain.

In Northern Manitoba, beyond the agricultural belt, the tourist travels over roads which skirt the shores of lakes on which fur traders built their trading posts. With the passing of the years many things have changed in Manitoba, but the great out-of-doors remains much as it was in the days of the pioneers. The old routes of trade and exploration remain, but now are re-defined in modern highways of Adventure — highways which carry 20th century visitors to vacation resorts, to hunting and fishing areas, to modern cities and towns, and to centres where major special attractions beckon the sportsman and family vacationist.

ROAD AND STREET SIGNS

On Manitoba's highways, traffic signs and markers are similar to those in other parts of Canada and in the United States. The provincial speed limits are reasonable — 30 m.p.h. in cities, 40 m.p.h. on highways by day, 50 m.p.h. at night unless otherwise posted. Careful driving and strict observance of road regulations will help prevent accidents.

The United States and Canadian gasoline measures are not the same. The Canadian gallon is based on the imperial quart, which is one-fifth larger than the United States quart. Five gallons Canadian equals six United States gallons. It would be well to remember this when you want your tank filled.
